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Summary of Results

ROUND 3 AFROBAROMETER SURVEY IN UGANDA

The Afrobarometer is an independent, non-partisan research instrument that measures the social, political and economic atmosphere in Africa. It is a comparative series of public attitude surveys on democracy, markets and civil society covering 18 African countries. Between April 12th and May 4th 2005, the Afrobarometer surveyed a nationally representative random, stratified probability sample of 2,400 Ugandans. Face to face interviews were conducted by Wilsken Agencies Ltd in 47 out of Uganda's 56 districts reaching both urban and rural areas as well as all four administrative regions of the country.

This summary of results covers all items of questionnaire instrument used. For item each albeit a few exceptions results are presented in table format as an aggregate national statistic and by *urban-rural* and *male-female* breakdown. Only results tables are presented here without any accompanying write up. For some survey items, ONLY national summary results are presented basing on clarity and avoidance of 'very small cases' by gender or residence subgroups.

Items retain their actual numbering and chronological order as it appears in the survey questionnaire.

The objective of this form of presentation is to provide our users and consumers with a simple summary of the results to every item of the survey.

More detailed write ups and analysis of the results are covered in short serialized bulletins focusing on specific themes as either requested by our users and consumers or as per the discretion of the authors. We encourage all users and consumers of these results to make requests of any further results breakdowns and analysis regarding any item(s) of specific interest to them.
