



# Citizen views on elections, on Eskom, and on the effects of climate change

Findings from Afrobarometer Round 9 survey in South Africa



### At a glance



- <u>Electricity</u>: Most South Africans say other actors besides Eskom should be allowed to generate and distribute electricity.
- Climate change: Half of the population say they have never heard of climate change.
- <u>Elections</u>: A growing majority of South Africans would be willing to forgo elections if a non-elected government could provide security, jobs, and housing.


#### What is Afrobarometer?



- A pan-African, non-partisan, non-profit survey research network that provides reliable data on Africans' experiences and evaluations of democracy, governance, and quality of life.
- Eight survey rounds in up to 39 African countries have been completed since 1999. Round 9 surveys are currently underway.
- Mission: To make citizen voice a key pillar of African policy and decision making.
- A national partner in each country conducts the survey. In South Africa, the Afrobarometer Round 9 survey was conducted by the Institute for Justice and Reconciliation.

### Methodology




- Nationally representative sample of adult citizens
  - All respondents are randomly selected.
  - Sample is distributed across regions/states/provinces and urban/rural areas in proportion to their share in the national population.
  - Every adult citizen has an equal chance of being selected.
- Face-to-face interviews in the language of the respondent's choice.
- Standard questionnaire allows comparisons across countries and over time.
- Sample size in South Africa of 1,582 adult citizens yields a margin of error of +/-2.5 percentage points at a 95% confidence level.
- Fieldwork for Round 9 in South Africa was conducted between 26 November and 19 December 2022.

### **Electricity**




### **Key findings**



- Electricity ranks third among the most important problems that South Africans want their government to address, trailing only unemployment and crime/security.
- Most South Africans say the government is doing a poor job of providing a reliable supply of electricity.
- A majority of citizens say Eskom should be privatised.
- An even greater proportion of South Africans say the government should allow other actors to generate and distribute electricity.


#### Most important problems | South Africa | 2022


## Government performance in provision of reliable electricity supply | South Africa | 2022








### Climate change

### **Key findings**



- Half of South African adults say they have never heard of climate change.
- Women, rural residents, the elderly, the poor, and the less educated are less likely to be familiar with climate change.
- Among those who are aware of climate change, majorities agree that:
  - It is making life in South Africa worse.
  - The government should take immediate action, even at considerable cost.
  - Both citizens and the government have important roles to play in limiting its effects.


#### Climate change awareness | South Africa | 2022

# Climate change awareness | by demographic group | South Africa | 2022




**Respondents were asked:** Have you heard about climate change or haven't you had the chance to hear about this yet? (% who have heard of climate change)




# Can ordinary citizens play a role in limiting climate change? | South Africa | 2022


# Must government act now to limit climate change? | South Africa | 2022


### **Democracy and elections**

### **Key findings**



- A majority of South Africans are dissatisfied with their country's democracy.
- Citizens support elections but don't think they work well.
- A growing majority would be willing to forgo elections in favour of a government that delivers security, jobs, and housing.
- In a hypothetical election, the African National Congress would hold the lead, with about one-third of respondents, but a larger share decline to state a voting intention.


#### Satisfaction with democracy | South Africa | 2022




**Respondents were asked:** Overall, how satisfied are you with the way democracy works in South Africa?



#### Extent of democracy | South Africa | 2022






Respondents were asked: In your opinion, how much of a democracy is South Africa today?



# Support elections as the best way to choose leaders | South Africa | 2022




**Respondents were asked:** Which of the following statements is closest to your view? Statement 1: We should choose our leaders in this country through regular, open, and honest elections.

(% who "agree" or "strongly agree" with each statement)




#### Efficacy of elections | South Africa | 2022


# Freeness and fairness of election | South Africa | 2022



**Respondents were asked:** On the whole, how would you rate the freeness and fairness of the last national election, held in 2019?




# Fear of intimidation or violence in 2019 election | South Africa | 2022

## Can powerful people find out how you voted? | South Africa | 2022






**Respondents were asked:** How likely do you think it is that powerful people can find out how you voted, even though there is supposed to be a secret ballot in this country?



# **Trust in South African Electoral Commission** | South Africa | 2022






**Respondents were asked:** How much do you trust the South African Electoral Commission, or haven't you heard enough about them to say?




#### Willing to forgo elections | South Africa | 2006-2022


# **Do citizens feel close to a political party?** | South Africa | 2022

### Conclusions

#### Conclusions



- An overwhelming majority of South Africans say the government is doing a poor job of providing electricity and other power producers should be allowed to generate and distribute electricity.
- Awareness of climate change remains low, especially among women, rural residents, the elderly, the poor, and the less educated.
- South Africans' faith in democracy is weak, and while citizens value elections, they do not believe that they work well.
- Increasing numbers of the population would be willing to forgo elections in favour of a non-elected government that provides security, jobs, and housing.
