Household Selection Procedure

Interviewer: It is your job to select a random (this means any) household. A household is a group of people who currently eat together from the same pot.

Start your walk pattern from the start point that has been randomly chosen by your Field Supervisor. Each of the four team members should be assigned a starting point within the SAL. The team leader should identify random starting points so the 4 interviews done in the SAL are selected from about one-half (or one-third) of all households in the SAL. Starting at each assigned point, the interviewer should count houses on both the right and the left (and starting with those on the right if they are opposite each other). For the 4 interviewers deployed to administer the survey in a SAL, each will do 1 interview. In the majority of cases where the number of HH is fairly large (100 HH or more), the normal AB household interval of 5/10 should apply, with 5 HHs for 1st interview, and 10 HHs if a substitution is needed due to a refusal. However, in case the SAL is fairly small (30 HHs or less), then the HH count for 1st interview should be reduced as follows. For small SALs (with less than 30 households), the intervals should be 2/2, for medium sized SALs (i.e. 30 – 100 households) the interval should be 5/5 and for big SALs (i.e. over 100 households) the interval should be 5/10. If the settlement comes to an end and there are no more houses, turn at right angles to the right and keep walking, continuing to count until finding the nth dwelling, i.e. 2nd, 5th or 10th dwelling
