AB update

November 2023 highlights



In the field and around the network

- ✓ AB is piloting new survey modules, assessing potential first-time countries to add, and readying to conduct Round 10 fieldwork in at least two countries before the end of the year.
- With Laws. Africa and the Data for Governance Alliance, AB launched its <u>country scorecards</u> on child well-being at the African Commission of Experts on the Rights and Welfare of the Child (ACERWC) in Addis Ababa.
- Through a policy users survey in 10 countries, the network is examining visibility and use of AB data and analysis.
- ✓ AB pursued dissemination of Round 9 findings, including 39-country Pan-Africa Profiles on <u>child well-being</u>, <u>youth</u> <u>priorities</u>, and <u>gender based violence</u>.
- AB wrapped up its summer school in Pretoria, South Africa, and trained francophone national partners' communications managers (at right) in Casablanca, Morocco.
- The AB-led Data for Governance Alliance held a stakeholder convening on democracy, governance, and human rights in Nairobi and conducted data analysis training for 20 civil society representatives from Southern Africa.


